## Message from City Council

It has been an honor to serve our community. Sustainable economic development and effective management of the City's limited resources have been my top priorities during my last 7+ years of service. We have been hard at work to create

an environment that fosters desirable growth, demands efficiency in our operations, and strives to improve the outside perception of our community so we can attract new businesses and residents. Our new mission states: "To promote and ensure a high quality of life, economic vitality, and a uniquely desirable community identity."

Englewood relies heavily on the sales and use taxes, generated by our local businesses, to help pay for the majority of the wonderful services that our residents deserve and have come to expect. Economic conditions have improved over the last few years but we still face significant challenges. The 2013 and 2014 fiscal years marked banner accomplishments for the City as we actually ended both fiscal years with a surplus in the General Fund for the first time since 2008. This year looks even better with all the economic activity in our community and the April 2015 Financial Report shows that year-to-date sales and use tax revenues are up over 13.1% year-to-date over 2014. We have also recently successfully completed some major restructuring of our organization that will make our operations more efficient and reduce costs to our community. Nevertheless, we still have many capital projects that have been deferred that need funding soon. Needless to say, we must remain diligent to ensure a sustainable future.

As many of you know, I have been hosting monthly community meetings to help keep our community informed about what's going on in the City of Englewood and to get feedback from you. I believe that with this feedback, I can better represent us as a whole. The monthly meetings are held at the Twin Dragon Restaurant, located at 3021 S. Broadway. I typically host these meetings on the last Wednesday of every month at 6 PM (although we sometimes need to reschedule so check my webpage or e-mail). Our next meeting will be held on Wednesday, July 29th. Please take a look at my webpage for updates or e-mail me with "Add Me" in the subject line to be added to the list for e-mail updates.



### Garage Sale Reminder

Planning a garage sale this summer? Our Traffic Engineer offers this friendly reminder about garage sale signs.

#### Sign Guidelines

- Signs can be no larger than 18"X18".
- Signs must not obstruct the view of traffic or hinder municipal operations.
- Signs must include the address of the person holding the sale and the sale dates.
- Signs can be posted a maximum of only 3 days before the date of the sale and must be removed the day after the sale.
