



November 6 Election to be conducted by mail ballot

In the upcoming mail ballot election, Englewood voters will elect four City Council Members: one from District 1; one from District 3; and two from the city At Large. Eight candidates are running for the four positions. Each of the positions is a four-year term. The candidates are listed on the following candidate profile pages in the order they will appear on the ballot.

The candidates were offered an opportunity to provide information about themselves for this election edition of the newsletter. The candidate profiles are printed verbatim, beginning on page two.

Voters are also being asked to decide on three ballot questions, all of which reflect proposed amendments to the City of Englewood's Charter. Two of the ballot questions (No. 2A and No. 2B) have been referred to voters by Englewood City Council; the other (No. 200) is a citizen-initiated question.

The November 6 election will be held by mail ballot, and is being coordinated with the Arapahoe County Clerk's Office. Arapahoe County will mail the ballots between October 12 and 22. See page 11 for details about this year's election.



Being committed to my hometown, my election to Council will help ensure that the community values I have experienced will


continue to flourish and Englewood will be a place anyone would proudly call "HOME."

Ballot Questions

In the November election, Englewood voters will decide on the following ballot questions specific to Englewood. The questions are listed below in the exact wording that will appear on the ballot. Please keep in mind there may be other candidates and issues that will appear on your ballot as well. Background information on the ballot questions is available at our City Clerk's Office, the Library, the Malley Center, and the Recreation Center.

Question No. 200

Shall Article XV, ENGLEWOOD EMPLOYEE RELATIONS AND CAREER SERVICE SYSTEM ACT – 1981, of the Home Rule Charter of the City of Englewood, Colorado be amended by changing Section 137:5 and by adding Section 137:9 as follows:

137:5 Subjects for collective bargaining.

(a) Mandatory Subjects. The City and the certified employee representative shall have the mutual obligation to negotiate and bargain in good faith over the following mandatory subjects: wages, hours, vacation, insurance (contribution levels and levels of benefits only), holidays, administrative leave, personal leave, military leave, disability leave, funeral leave, ~~dues deduction~~, grievance resolution procedure (including costs and expenses associated therewith), non-State or Federally regulated or mandated pension or retirement provisions (contribution levels only), over-time pay formulas, work uniform provisions, acting pay, longevity, transfer procedure, procedures for suspension, demotion and discharge, and education incentives. That the maintenance of benefits shall also be considered a mandatory subject under this Section for the period covering up to and including December 31, 1984, after which it will become a permissive subject.

(b) Non-Negotiable Subjects. The following subjects shall be excluded from collective bargaining as non-negotiable subjects of bargaining: any subject pre-empted by State or Federal law or by City Charter; State or Federally regulated or mandated pension provisions; administration of insurance programs, selection of insurance carrier including self-insurance; matters delegated by Charter to any board or commission of the City; all matters relating to classification, recruitment, hiring, examination and certification of appointment to a position and appeals based thereupon; promotions out of the bargaining unit.

(c) Permissive Subjects. Collective bargaining upon any other subject (i.e., not mandatory or non-negotiable) is permissive and may be conducted if mutually agreed to by the parties.

137:9 Deductions allowable from payroll compensation.

No payroll deduction shall be taken from the payroll compensation of any employee except for deductions required by Federal Law; judicial liens and garnishments, including court-ordered child support, domestic support and maintenance obligations and payments; deductions for employee benefits and pensions as established by law for such employee; and deductions for contributions to charities and organizations exempt from Federal Income Tax under Sec. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986. Provided that, any such employee authorizing a charitable deduction shall provide written authorization consenting to such charitable deduction, at least annually. A charge may be assessed to a charitable organization that receives the benefit from the payroll deduction to offset the cost for this service.

Question No. 2 A

Shall the Home Rule Charter of the City of Englewood, Article X, Part I, Section 94, be amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE X: FINANCE ADMINISTRATION

PART I. BUDGET

94: Appropriations to lapse.

Any annual appropriation or any portion thereof remaining unexpended and unencumbered at the close of the budget year shall lapse and revert to the General Fund; except for appropriations for construction or maintenance of permanent improvements from the Public Improvement Fund or other such funds designated by City Council which shall not lapse until the purpose for which the appropriation was made shall have been accomplished or abandoned as provided in Article X, Part I, Section 96 of the Englewood Home Rule Charter.

Question No. 2 B

Shall the Home Rule Charter of the City of Englewood, Article X, Part IV, Section 117, be amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE X: FINANCE ADMINISTRATION

PART IV. PURCHASES AND SALES

117: Property sales.

The purchasing officer shall determine the value of surplus items no longer of use to the City. Articles without value may be disposed of in a manner most advantageous to the City. Items of value shall be advertised for sale in a manner deemed most effective and efficient to the City; if no bids are received for the advertised articles, the purchasing officer shall dispose of the articles in a manner most advantageous to the City.

Details on the Election

The Englewood City Clerk's Office is coordinating closely with Arapahoe County on this year's election. The November 6 election will be held by mail ballot – there will be no polling places for this election. The ballots will be mailed by the County Clerk's Office between October 12 and 22, 2007.

The candidates and questions listed in this newsletter pertain specifically to the City of Englewood's portion of the ballot.

How do I return my ballot?

Detailed instructions on returning your ballot will be included with the ballot you receive. If you prefer not to return your ballot by mail, you can drop it off at any of the locations listed on the back page of this newsletter. All ballot drop-off locations will be open from 7 am to 7 pm on Election Day.

If you choose to drop off your ballots rather than mail them, you should be aware that, according to Colorado Secretary of State Election Rules, you may drop off no more than five mail ballots from members of your household.

Ballots must be received by 7 pm on Tuesday, November 6 in order to be counted.

- **Ballots will be mailed: October 12-22**
- **Election Day: November 6 – ballots due by 7 pm**

How do I know if I am an active voter?

If you are registered to vote, but did not vote in the last General Election, your voter registration may be considered inactive. Ballots will not be mailed to those listed as inactive, but you will be allowed to vote. Contact the Arapahoe County Clerk's Election Office at 303-795-4511 or visit the Election Office at 5334 S. Prince Street in Littleton to pick up a ballot and find out about reactivating your registration.

What questions will be on my ballot?

This newsletter includes all the City of Englewood-specific questions that will be on the ballot, but please keep in mind your ballot may also include questions and candidates related to County, State, School Board, and special districts.


