Englewood's Sharing Spaces

With shared work spaces – commonly called coworking – saturating the Denver metro area, it’s no surprise that Englewood is seeing them pop up around the city.

Coworking is usually an open, shared work environment with tenants independently working in a variety of industries. Shared work spaces offer office space or a single desk for monthly fees or daily drop-in rates, available to start-ups looking for their first space or people who work-from-home looking to get out of the house.

Whatever the reason, cowork spaces are filling up fast and Englewood is home to at least three.

Cobalt

Englewood’s first co-working space, Cobalt offers 14,000 square feet of offices, conference rooms, private phone-call rooms, bathrooms, kitch-

ens and a second-floor terrace.

For the past two-and-a-half years, owner Grant Whiteside has rented out offices, single personal desks or floating desks for a monthly fee. Cobalt does not do daily drop-ins. Standard with most shared work spaces, Cobalt offers internet, a kitchen and a shower – for those who bike to work.

At first, Whiteside saw a lot of tenants come from home offices – anxious for social interaction and a sense of community. Lately, more tenants come from other coworking spaces in Denver.

People are looking for easy parking, lightrail access and to be closer to the trail system – everything Englewood has to offer.

“Englewood is the most amazing social gem,” Whiteside said. “People in the know – know.”

in a 1917 original ranch house from Englewood’s days of carnation fields.

Owners McCorry and Kelly James take pride in maintaining the home’s history and character.

“It feels like you’re coming home,” James said. “The whole space feels really comfortable.”

McCorry, a home-based photographer, was used to working at home – sometimes, in the winter, going weeks without human interaction other than his wife. He hopes Blend becomes a

Message from City Council

Dear Neighbors,

As we near the end of the year, I'd like to highlight a few Englewood accomplishments and provide a roadmap for some important goals.

We continue to focus on sustainability of our operations with an emphasis on economic development and effective management of our limited resources. 2016 represents the first budgeted surplus in many years for the General Fund and looks to be nearly the 4th year in a row with a yearend surplus!

Although we have resolved our structural deficit through operational changes, we continue to face financial challenges. We must remain diligent in our efforts to be efficient with so many long term capital needs to address in the coming years.

We have been hard at work to create an environment that fosters a robust local economy. We will continue to improve customer service to our core customers, residents and businesses. We just hosted our first annual job fair and we were successful in securing the participation of 32 local primary employers with over 500 jobs available! Englewood relies heavily on the sales and use taxes, generated by our local businesses, to help pay for our community services. This partnership with local business means that when local business succeeds, we succeed as a community.

We will strive to improve Englewood's image and the perception of our community as a place to live and do business. We will attempt to better communicate our value proposition by conveying points of pride in our community and hope for our future. I see wonderful opportunities with our unique community history and cultural arts that need to be better communicated to the public. I envision a more robust quarterly publication and website. I also plan to host the first State of the City event in the first quarter of 2017.

We will focus on physical improvements to our public places to make them more desirable places to be. I believe that we should begin with our historic downtown (the 3400 block of South Broadway) because with some small improvements, we will develop a better identity and attract more needed investment, activity and vitality.

Englewood Recreation Center Drop-In Child Care

Englewood Recreation Center now offers drop-in child care for children 6 months to 8 years while parents utilize the Recreation Center.

Child care is available Monday-Thursday 4-8 pm and Friday and Saturday 8 am - 1 pm. Maximum time limit is 2 hours, for \$6 or \$5 for residents.

Child care is available on a first-come, first-serve basis and parents must remain inside the Recreation Center at all times. Reservations are not accepted.

Parents are asked to supply a carrier or chair for any child who is unable to sit up on his/her own.

No personal care, such as diaper changing or feeding, will be provided. In the event of such requirements, parents will be notified.

No food or drink will be permitted in the child care center, with the exception of water.

All children must be signed in and out by their parents/guardians and payment can be made on a daily basis at the front desk.
